What is the Safeguards Rule?

As a part of its implementation of the GLB Act, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) issued the Safeguards Rule, which requires financial institutions under FTC jurisdiction to have measures in place to keep customer information secure.

Under the Safeguard Rule, financial institutions must protect consumer information they collect such as names, credit card account numbers, income, and more.

Priority Title not only follows these standards, but leads the way utilizing up to date procedures to prevent any data breach. We care about the security of our customers' personal information as if it were our own.

What are the requirements handling and Transmitting private information Online

The Safeguard Rule requires companies to develop a written information security plan that describes their program to protect customer information.

The plan must be appropriate to the company's size and complexity, the nature and scope of its activities, and the sensitivity of the customer information it handles.
